

KINGDOM SERVICE (MINISTRY AND PURPOSE)

1. Created for Service

- Ephesians 2:10 — “We are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works.”
- Every believer is called to serve for a divine purpose.
- Salvation is not just about being saved from sin but being saved for a purpose in Christ.
- We are created to do His good works saved to make a difference, not just to live free from sin.
- Good works are fruits of salvation ,they are seen through the life you live.

Ask yourself: Am I living for myself, or for kingdom impact?

- Genesis 1:26–28 — We are called to dominate, rule, and serve creation.

2. Christ as the Example of Service

- Mark 10:45 — “For even the Son of Man came not to be served, but to serve.”
- Christ’s life is our standard: humility, love, and sacrifice.
- “The one who humbles himself and becomes least shall be great in the Kingdom of God.” (Matthew 23:11–12)
- When you serve others, you demonstrate Christ to them.
- Service is the heartbeat of God’s Kingdom.

3. The Purpose and Power of Service

- We should actively participate in the work of God.with willing open hearts
- Salvation comes with purpose we were also created to serve others.
- Kingdom impact often comes through small acts of service, like checking in on someone, praying with or for them.

- It doesn't need to feel big to be impactful — faith the size of a mustard seed still moves mountains (Matthew 17:20).
- You are not called to serve man for approval but to serve God as His son.

4. Gifts Are for Service, Not Self

- 1 Peter 4:10 — “Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others.”
- The gifts you receive are not for personal gain but for service that's stewardship.
- e.g When water flows from a tap, it's not for the tap itself but for others to drink likewise, your gift exists to refresh others and it is by remaining in the presence of God that you will be fulfilled with power for impact
- Service multiplies impact: Matthew 13:12 (NIV) “Whoever has will be given more, and they will have an abundance. Whoever does not have, even what they have will be taken from them.”
- Be faithful with little so that you can be trusted with more. (Luke 16:10)
- Dorcas (Acts 9:36–42) used her gifts to serve and influence her community.

5. Faithfulness and Growth in Service

- Service starts where you are with what you have it's contextual.
- Don't despise small beginnings; they are what shape you. (Zechariah 4:10)
- Consistent faithfulness prepares you for major assignments.
- Spiritual maturity happens through service faithfulness brings multiplication, influence, and legacy.
- Identify your spiritual gifts and natural talents; use them to glorify God. (Romans 12:6–8)
- The perfection of your talent gives it value that can be used for impact “Your gift will make room for you.” (Proverbs 18:16)

6. Structure and Readiness for God's Move

- God moves through structure when He finds order, He releases blessing.
- Ask yourself: What do I want Him to bless me in? There must be an area or structure in place for God to use.

Example: Praying for a job, but also preparing your CV and applying.

- You don't wait for a big platform to start serving it starts now, where you are.
- Structure your life so God can move through it. Impact flows through divine order.
- Character comes before manifestation.

7. Service Through Prayer

- Praying for others your family, leaders, and government is a form of service. (1 Timothy 2:1-2)
- Intercession is kingdom work; it shapes destinies and brings God's will on earth. (Matthew 6:10)
